

# Introduction

Road crashes in the past few decades have emerged as one of the biggest causes of concern in the world and are identified as a leading cause of death globally. India records one of the highest numbers of people killed in road crashes in the world.

Delhi, the capital of India has witnessed a phenomenal increase in both human and vehicular population during the past few decades. There are over 10.60 million registered vehicles in Delhi. Despite the commissioning of Metro in Delhi and NCR, Carrying nearly 27 lakh commuters every day, the vehicle population in Delhi roads continues to grow with registration of about 7 lakh vehicles every year.

During 2016, 7375 fatal road crashes occurred in Delhi in which 7154 people were injured and 1591 people lost their lives. Data indicates that 42.86% of the total people killed in road crashes were pedestrians. Scooter/Motorcycle riders were the second most vulnerable victims constituting 35.9% of fatalities. Road crashes tend to increase from 08:00 pm to 02:00 am. National highways and major roads of the city are more crash prone due to heavy movement of commercial as well as other vehicles.

In year 2018, total accidents reported were 6275, out of which 1562 were deadly accidents. Total numbers of deaths due to road accidents reported in 2018 were 1604 and persons injured were 5831 (Dainik Jagran 18th Feb 2019, Pg. 6).

110 Black spots have been identified by Delhi Traffic Police wherein 1257 accidents have happened. 429 deadly accidents have been reported from such sites. Peeragarhi Chowk and Punjabi Bagh Chowk are among the black spots identified in District West.

Although the number of deaths in the road crashes in Delhi is declining since 2011 (from 2110 to 1591 in 2016), the need to promote preventive strategies for road safety remains urgent.

## **Background of Road Safety Week Celebration**

Celebrating the road safety campaign was initiated by the ISS India HSE (Health Safety and Environment) in order to make people aware about the national road safety in the Indian subcontinent. ISS India had declared to celebrate the Road Safety Week all through the country in the first week of the month of January. The aim of this campaign was to emphasize and accentuate people about the need of safe roads travel by applying just simple rules.

According to the information, it has been noted that approximately one lakh people are getting killed per year in the road accidents of India. There is one death every four minutes due to a road accident in India or some of them become sufferer of the life threatening problems such as mental trauma, loss of memory, loss of hand or legs and become disabled for the whole life. Such situations especially in India increase the importance and necessity of the road safety measures. India has a very huge population of the road travelers such as two wheelers, four wheelers on the road, that's why they must know the road safety rules.

It also need efforts from different stakeholders such as the community, transport sector, insurance sector, health sector, police, legal sector, educational institutions, highway engineers, vehicle manufacturers, public agencies, NGOs and etc. Students are given a big opportunity to be participated in the road safety week programme as to change something, youths of the country must understand first.

#### Some Figures on Road Accidents of India

- One serious road accident in the country occurs every minute and 16 die on Indian roads every hour.
- 1214 road crashes occur every day in India.
- Two wheelers account for 25% of total road crash deaths.
- 20 children under the age of 14 die every day due to road accidents in the country.
- 377 people die every day, equivalent to a jumbo jet crashing every day.

#### Mission

Ensure road safety for all roads users in the District, West of NCT of Delhi with priority to pedestrians and cyclists, to achieve zero fatalities due to road crashes in the long run.

#### Vision

- To achieve the goal of reduction in road crash incidents as well as fatalities.
- To prevent, reduce and check road injuries and fatalities on various roads of District West in coordination with all stakeholders and government agencies, and by focusing on 4 Es - Education, Enforcement, Engineering and Emergency care.

#### Objectives of Celebrating Road Safety Week

- The primary aim of the Road Safety Week is to create awareness and promote road safety in the community, schools, colleges, workplaces and on roads.
- Alert various road users groups with respect to their roles and responsibilities.
- Minimising injuries and deaths caused by road accidents by following road safety measures and traffic rules including traffic lights, speed limits, pedestrian rules, etc.
- Encouraging drivers to ensure that wear helmets in two wheelers, seat belts in four wheelers or more and not use mobile phones while driving.
- To aware people that do not drink, do not drive when tired and do not use radios while driving so that they can be pay attention on road.
- To maintain the speed and required distance from other vehicles
- To aware people that do not drink, do not drive when tired and do not use phones or radios while driving.
- To ensure implementation of the relevant directions given y Central or state government from time to time.










